### Applying for a PAL:

**Please note: A MyCFP Account is required for each individual who applies for a firearms licence (either Possession and Acquisition or Minor's) online or who wishes to access other online CFP services. Each MyCFP account must have a different email address. The email address must be exclusive to the applicant and cannot be used again for any other MyCFP account.**

**IF YOU ARE 18 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER, and a first time applicant, complete the Online Application on the RCMP Website - <https://rcmp.ca/en/firearms/apply-firearms-licence> or download and mail a PAL Application to the address indicated on the form.**

**IF YOU ARE BETWEEN THE AGES OF 12 AND 18, complete the Minors Online Application on the RCMP Website - <https://rcmp.ca/en/firearms/apply-firearms-licence> or call 1-800-731-4000 ext. 7503 to obtain a paper Minor's Licence application or for any questions you may have.**
